Subject: ARMED CARJACKING

Miami Police is investigating a robbery that took place at approximately 7:30 p.m., on June 30, 2019 at the 7 Eleven Gas Station located at 690 N.W. 79 Street.

According to detectives, one victim was sitting in the front passenger seat of a 2004 Nissan Frontier pick-up truck, when he was confronted by one of two armed suspects, who exited a newer model gray Nissan Altima. At gunpoint, both suspects demanded their belongings. The other victim, the driver of the pick-up truck, was attempting to secure his friend's bicycle (witness) onto the bed of the truck when he was confronted by the other armed suspect. Both suspects tussled with the victims. The passenger was able to free himself and ran into the 7 Eleven store for safety. The victim who was the driver, jumped onto the bed of the truck and armed himself with his shotgun in an attempt to protect himself and his property. Both suspects jumped into the pick-up truck and sped off, all the while the victim was still on the bed of the truck. Shortly thereafter, the suspects saw the victim had a weapon and stopped the pick-up truck and exchanged gunfire before fleeing on foot. The victim remained with his pick-up truck and call police for assistance.

Robbery Detectives are looking for:

Subject #1: dark-skinned black male, 5'07" – 5'08", 20 to 21 years old, last seen wearing a white t-shirt covering his face.

Subject #2: dark-skinned black male, 5'07" – 5'08", 150 to 160 pounds, 20 to 21 years old, last seen wearing a black t-shirt and white t-shirt covering his face.

Subject #3: getaway driver (NO DESCRIPTION)
