MALE SHOT AND ROBBED

On Thursday, June 18, 2020, at approximately 8:45 p.m. Miami Police officers responded to the area of N.E. 1st Avenue and N.E. 8th Street regarding a male who was shot at 50 N.E. 9 Street.

According to detectives, the victim and subject were observed in a brief tussle by several witnesses just before the shooting took place. The shooter, who is seen on surveillance video, approached the victim from behind, and within seconds discharges a firearm, striking the victim. The subject then fled the area eastbound towards N.E. 9th Street then northbound on N.E. 1st Avenue.

The victim managed to find his way to a nearby condominium in an effort to seek for help. Miami Fire Rescue responded and transported him to Jackson Memorial Hospital. The victim has since been listed in stable condition.

Further investigation revealed that the victim's watch and black fanny pack was stolen.

Detectives are still investigating leads and ask that anyone with additional information to contact the Miami Police Department and/or Crime Stoppers.

Detectives are looking for:

Suspect: Black male, approximately 5'09" – 5'10", slender face, clean shaven, slim built, approximately 28 to 35 years of age, 170 – 185 pounds with medium length dreads. Last seen wearing a red shirt with a yellow design with white lettering and black jeans. Armed with a firearm.
