Subject: BURGLARY / THEFT OF A DOG

Detectives are investigating a burglary that occurred at approximately 7:00 a.m. on February 26, 2020 at 1495 N.W. 29 Street.

On the afternoon of February 26, 2020 the victim called to report that her dog was stolen from her enclosed yard. Officers responded and the victim showed them video of the burglary.

The video footage shows that a black SUV parked near the victim's yard, a woman (suspect) gets off and walks to the closed gate where the dog was. Moments later, the suspect is seen walking back to the SUV with the victim's dog. It appears that the suspect had a leach or rope on the dog and guides the dog into the SUV.

Detectives are working the case and need assistance in identifying the suspect.

<u>Suspect:</u> White female, 30 - 55 years old, with long black hair, last seen wearing a coral colored t-shirt, black leggings, white socks and flip flops.

Vehicle: Black, 5 door, SUV.
