CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE MATERIAL ARREST

On February 3, 2026, a witness responded to the City of Miami Police Department and reported a disturbing incident involving his spouse, Daniel Nehemiah. The incident involved child sexual abuse material (CSAM).

According to the witness, the couple was involved in a domestic dispute when he confronted Nehemiah while cleaning their shared apartment. The witness observed Nehemiah seated at his laptop, reportedly watching inappropriate content featuring a young child. Upon noticing he was being watched, Nehemiah quickly closed the laptop and questioned the witness about what he had seen.

After the incident, the witness waited for Nehemiah to fall asleep and discovered a black hard drive on the defendant's nightstand. He recorded a video accessing the hard drive's contents, which revealed multiple folders containing CSAM, alongside personal images of the defendant. The witness then brought both the hard drive and laptop to the police station, where he presented the video evidence to law enforcement officers.

Based on the materials reviewed, officers confirmed that the files contained on the hard drive met the legal criteria for CSAM under Florida state law.

A search warrant was executed for the defendant's hard drive and laptop, leading to a forensic analysis that uncovered hundreds of CSAM files. During the arrest, Nehemiah exhibited signs of being under the influence of an unknown substance, which hindered the ability of officers to conduct an interview.

Nehemiah was arrested and transported to the Turner Guilford Knight Correctional Center (TGK) without incident.
